	<p>championships, there is a week's shooting in the Match Rifle Championships. The shooting in that is exclusively very long range (1000, 1100 and 1200 yards) and is generally shot with the aid of a telescope and heavier bullets. 3 of the HPS shot in all/part of this meeting. Ian Shaw shot with standard Target Rifle for the first 3 days and shot extremely well, considering the limitations of not using telescope/heavier bullets. Mike Barlow and Angus McLeod shot exceptionally well to be 1st and 2nd respectively in the Hopton (the Grand Aggregate over the 4 days of individual competition) ex 102 entries. Mike also won 3 of the individual trophies.</p> <p>During the Target Rifle meeting, the weather continued to be exceptionally hot, with light but tricky winds, particularly in the middle of the day. It was very noticeable in most of the competitions that the top scores were being made in particular details and in certain location on either the long or short range (e.g. right hand 10 targets) as they were most shielded from wind changes. Entries were down on previous years, but still had over 800 entrants for all the matches, including a number of foreign teams. All 7 of the HPS members were squadded in the same details so that they experienced the same conditions during their shoots, as far as possible.</p> <p>All 7 of the HPS members shot in the Scottish National Match team (20 firers) and 6 in the Mackinnon (12 firers) with the 7th being reserve in the match.</p> <p>Individually, there was some exceptional shooting. Sam Hunter was 2nd in the Prince of Wales in a tie shoot, immediately after he had won the second stage of the Queen's Prize; he was also 51st in the Grand Aggregate. Angus McLeod was 2nd in the St George's final, 5th in the Queen's 1st stage and 4th in the second stage. Iain Robertson shot very well at long range and was 5th in the Donaldson Memorial 1st stage (over 4 ranges) and 21st in the final; he was also 41st in the Grand Aggregate. Bruce Logan was 10th in the Grand Aggregate and 5th in the Lovell. Ian Shaw shot steadily throughout with a 16th place in Queen's first stage, 45th in the Grand Aggregate and 33rd in the George's final. Mike Barlow shot steadily also, but without any really big scores, except in the final stage of the Queen's when he had a 75 with 13 V's at the 900 yard range.</p>

Outline of Competition logistics	<p>The Championships were run under CG rules, which are effectively ICFRA rules, and used the batch of ammunition that will be used in the 2014 Commonwealth Games. They were also shot on ICFRA targets which are slightly more difficult at short range and markedly so at long range than the NRA pattern used in the preceding week at the National championships. It should be noted that these CSF Championships were shot over 2 ½ days: the same course of fire will take 5 days at the 2014 Games.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Monday 22nd - 3 matches - Pairs Match for principal pair and Pairs Match for an U-25 Pair, and shot alongside was a Badge Match for a 3rd representative from each country.
