SHOOTING

REGULAR ARMY HOSTS INTERNATIONAL SMALL BORE SHOOTING IN BAOR  
RHINE ARMY SMALL BORE OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS - GERMANY

The English, Scottish and Welsh small bore national teams, including the CURRENT World Champion, Alister Allan from Scotland, competed in the Rhine Army Open Championships - held at the NATO Sennelager Training Ranges near Paderborn, Germany - with the British Army and American Forces in Europe teams.

For the national teams this international meeting is an important event in their shooting calendar as the scores count towards selection in the team trials for British and National teams this year for the MINI Commonwealth Games in the Autumn in DUNDEE, which lead to the 1982 Commonwealth Games matches in BRISBANE. It also gives them an opportunity to see what the top American Army in Europe shooters are up to and to compete against the crack British Army team.

The shooting took place under the National Small Bore Rifle Association rules, shooting took place over 3 days, 6/7/8 June and the winners were:
